Avocado Statistics State of Hawai‘i, 2017-2025

Hawai‘i’s avocado production is estimated at 880,000 pounds during the 2025 crop year, up 19% from the previous crop year. Bearing acreage increased 21% to 740 acres, while yield per acre stayed the same at 1,200 pounds per acre, compared to the previous crop year.

The farm price of avocados averaged \$1.49 per pound, a 9% increase from the previous year, and reached the second highest since 2017. The value of utilized production totaled \$1.14 million, a 26% increase over the same period. The amount harvested but unsold avocados was 50% up to 120,000 pounds from the previous year. Utilized production is estimated at 760,000 pounds, up 15% from the previous season.

Chart 1: Avocado Acreage and Yield, Hawai‘i, 2017 to 2025.

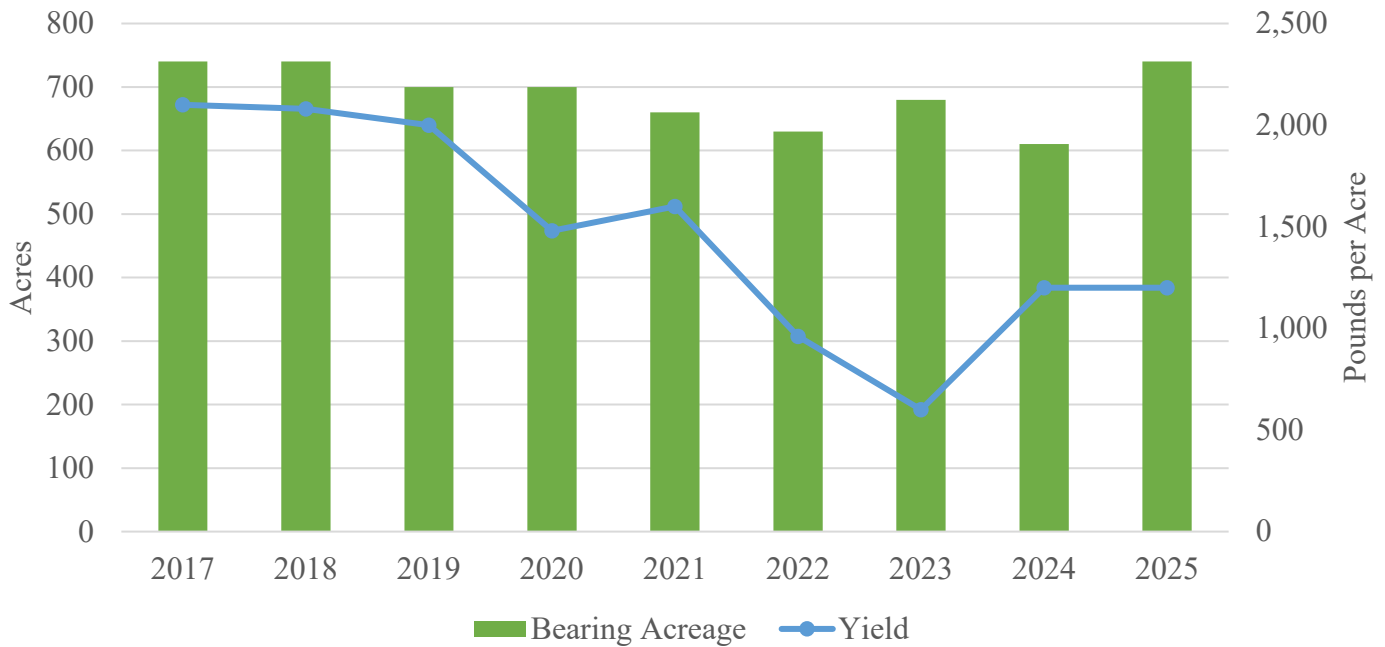


Chart 2: Avocado Utilized Production and Price, Hawai‘i, 2017 to 2025.
