## IV. INTRODUCTION AND COMMENTS

Chairperson Enright thanked the Board and the Deputy Attorney General for attending the board meetings. He then opened the floor for testimony.

Juanita Brown Kawamoto expressed concerns about the impending vote and the impact that it would have on Cloverleaf Dairy.

## V. COMMUNICATIONS FROM DIVISIONS AND ADMINISTRATION

## A. QUALITY ASSURANCE DIVISION

1. Request by Hawaii milk producer for a waiver in accordance with the amendment to Section 4-60-10, Hawaii Administrative Rules, entitled, "Minimum prices in the Hawaii milk shed." Allowing milk producers in the Hawaii milk shed to petition the Board of Agriculture for a waiver to the minimum milk prices paid by distributors to producers.

Jeri Kahana of the Quality Assurance Division presented a request for a waiver to allow Big Island Dairy and Clover Leaf Dairy, if they wish to, to sell milk at less than the minimum price in the Hawaii Milk Shed, if it can be demonstrated that the price takes into consideration certain standards specified in Section 157-32, HRS. It will be up to the Board whether the waiver should be granted or not.

Chairperson Enright then asked if there is a dairy in the audience that would like to request a waiver.

Brad Duff of Big Island Dairy approached the Board to request a waiver so they have the chance to sell their milk at a lower price than what is mandated by the Milk Act. He then made him self available for questions and comments.

Chairperson Enright stated that one of the questions is the dairy's economic viability if this was granted.

Mr. Duff stated that they have watched their own costs and business affairs, and they ran the numbers to ensure that they can be profitable if they do sell at lower than the current minimum price. They watched the markets and the numbers, and they felt the Big Island would be the market that would be profitable for them.

1 Chairperson Enright then asked Mr. Duff if he looked at the financials and the situation looking forward.

Mr. Duff said looking at future prices for milk, they anticipate the prices to follow what it trades for in the market. Big Island Dairy ran the numbers to verify that they are profitable, they are confident that after looking at their cost of doing business, they should be profitable moving forward.

Chairperson Enright then asked at that point if Clover Leaf Dairy would like to come forward and request a waiver.

Mr Boteilho stated everything has been done and he was planning to stay within the Milk Control Act.
