Chairperson Enright moved on to the agenda item on Communications from Divisions.

V. COMMUNICATIONS FROM DIVISIONS AND ADMINISTRATION

A. AGRICULTURAL LOAN DIVISION

1. Request for Approval of One (1) Direct Farm Ownership Loan to Owen K. Kaneshiro Farms LLC, Owen K. Kaneshiro and Ann K. Kaneshiro, coborrowers.

Presentation by Kevin Yokoyama, HDOA/AGL, as submitted. The farm has operated since 1980 in Waianae. Production is managed by rotating crops and utilization of cover crops. The Class A loan of \$495,000 is for 11 acres, a fee simple parcel which includes 10 acres of production land, labor houses, and farming equipment for a period of 25 years. Staff recommends approval.

Board members Hong and Ha joined.

Chairperson Enright called for a motion to entertain this request: Russell/Hashimoto.

Hearing no questions or comments, Chairperson Enright called for a vote on the question.

B. AGRICULTURAL RESOURCE MANAGEMENT DIVISION

 Request for Approval to Sublease between the Hamakua Agricultural Cooperative and Michael Manor; General Lease No. S-5553; TMK (3) 4-3-003:004 (por); Lots 11, 12, and 22, Opihilala & Hauola, Hamakua, Island of Hawaii

Presentation by Joyce Wong, HDOA/ARM, as submitted. She described the location, sublessors, and sublease terms. The farm has organic vegetables and looks to expand business with additional lots. Staff recommends approval.

Chairperson Enright called for a motion to entertain this request: Hashimoto/Galimba.

Hearing no questions or comments, Chairperson Enright called for a vote on the question.

Vote: Approved, 9/0.

2. Request for Approval to Sublease between the Hamakua Agricultural Cooperative and Jianguo Wang; General Lease No. S-5553, TMK: 3rd Div/4-3-005:014 (por); Lot 16, Opihilala & Hauola, and Kaunamanu Homesteads, Hamakua, Island of Hawaii

Presentation by Joyce Wong, HDOA/ARM, as submitted. Mr. Wang holds a long-term sublease for lot 16 with sweet potatoes and bananas. He has since established a market for zucchini and eggplant. The additional parcels will accommodate expansion. Mr. Wang qualifies as bone fide farmer. Staff recommends approval.

Chairperson Enright called for a motion to entertain this request: Galimba/Ha.

Hearing no questions or comments, Chairperson Enright called for a vote on the question.

3. Request for Approval of Extension of Sublease between the Hamakua Agricultural Cooperative and Maritez Libed; General Lease No. S-5553; TMK: 3rd Div/4-6-003:003 (por), Lot 28, Opihilala & Hauola, Hamakua, Island of Hawaii

Presentation by Joyce Wong, HDOA/ARM, as submitted. Maritez Libed has held a sublease with the Hamakua Agricultural Cooperative from May1, 2013 – May 1, 2016. Her farm is comprised of mixed vegetables, eggplant, okra, other seasonable vegetables, banana, and coffee. She is a bona fide farmer. Staff recommends approval.

Chairperson Enright called for a motion to entertain this request: Russell/Hashimoto.

Hearing no questions or comments, Chairperson Enright called for a vote on the question.

C. ANIMAL INDUSTRY DIVISION

 Request for Approval of a Right-of-Entry (ROE) in favor of the Board of Water Supply to Install a Monitor Well on the Animal Quarantine Station Property

Presentation by Isaac Maeda, HDOA/Animal Industry Division, as submitted. The Board of Water Supply is asking to construct a monitoring well, to take samples of ground water, and an ROE to do so. ROE is proposed for 20 years. The actual installation of the well is anticipated that it will not create a noise hazard to the animals in the area. The Board of Water Supply will create noise abatement. Staff recommends approval.

Chairperson Enright called for a motion to entertain this request: Evans/Galimba.

Chair called the Board of Water Supply representatives forward.

Erwin Kawata, Program Administrator for the Water Quality Division from BWS, and Joseph Tracy, Principle Geologist from Intera Incorporated.

In answer to questions from Board member Case, Mr. Kawata said that the monitoring well is in the Pearl Harbor aquifer, Waimalu sub-aquifer. The well will penetrate the subsurface to study the underlying geology, test underground water, and examine the movement of subsurface water in the area. This monitoring well is designed to provide information about the pollutants from the Navy.

In answer to questions from Board member Evans, Mr. Kawata said that they want to understand ground water flow direction. This well will help them understand the water movement across the valley as well as down the valley and subsurface features. Mr. Kawata also said that the nearest supply well to this monitoring well was the Halawa Shaft, northwest of the facility about a mile away. It serves the metropolitan Honolulu water system, one of the largest systems servicing about 8000 gallons a day.

In answer to further questions from Board member Case, Mr. Tracy said that the depth of the well would be 135 feet, but was unsure as to whether the water table had gone down in past years.

Board member Hong asked if they were going to be sampling across the vertical water column. Mr. Kawata said that they will study subsurface geology and take water samples along the top of the water table.

Hearing no further questions or comments, Chairperson Enright called for a vote on the question.

 Board member Russell said that he had heard a report from the Merry Monarch that a person had muddy boots in their bag while travelling home to another island. He hoped that the airports provided for sterilization of boots. He also said that the owner from Austria of a lot in Hana issued a letter permitting access to the source of fire ants in that area. The Maui Invasive Species Council is now addressing that matter.
