Training consists of workshops, hands-on learning, conversations with farmers and agricultural specialists beginning June – August 2013. Learn about farming methods, access to land, credit, business plans, food safety, pesticides, organic farming, and much more. Training may be available in Burmese, Chinese, Ilokano, Korean, Lao, Samoan, Tagalog, Thai, Tongan, Vietnamese, and other languages, depending upon enrollment.
