  - a. Proposed Water Rate Changes

  - A. System update refer to attachment
  - B. Capital Improvement:
    - 1. Waikolu Valley fiberglass walkway project. Promethius work is in progress, estimated at 1-2 more months until completion.
    - 2. Meter Replacement, completed as can. Other meters will need to be a new CIP with survey.
    - 3. Sluice gates/ Diversion Dam Pump: waiting on Promethius to finish first
    - 4. Transmission Line Couplings: starting in April
    - 5. Clearing the brush on the reservoir banks: starting in April
    - 6. Silt is building up in the reservoir and will need to be cleaned out as a future CIP
  - C. Financial Updates: See attached. MIS and the state are both red right now.
    - a. HECO is a large amount (around 30%) of the listed expenses. HECO is a public utility, and the solar grid is currently saturated.
    - b. Other expenses is around 50% of the listed expenses. This is likely pump maintenance contracts and on call contractors, as well as gas, etc. The board would like the state to provide a breakdown of the "other expenses" category for the next meeting.
    - c. There are currently only a few main users of the MIS (4-6 accounts), which account for the majority of the incoming revenue.
    - d. The MISUAB has also asked the state for a breakdown with all 5 systems.

- e. The MISUAB has asked the state to provide the overall budget numbers so we can determine where we're at according to the budget.
- f. THE MISUAB would like the state to provide a new service area map which includes the new DHHL Na'iwa subdivision. There was some discussion including that the Na'iwa ag lot residents currently have DHHL potable water, but can apply for agricultural rates. DHHL will have to pay for the infrastructure to get MIS supply.

#### **Molokai Irrigation Tasks**

April 2<sup>nd</sup> We flushed the Transmission pipeline from the West Portal to the reservoir.

April 8<sup>th</sup> We went through the tunnel to do our monthly maintenance in the valley. We flushed out the diversion dams cleaned the gratings and clean out the diversion dam building.

All daily/Monthly duties is on going for the month.
